CABIN CHECKLIST

The standards to make sure your cabin has

- Bedding (sheets, blankets, etc.) and towels
- Dish soap, sponge, and towels
- Cleaning Supplies (broom, dustpan, cleaner)
- Paper towels (you may want to bring extra even if they provide a starter roll)
- Toilet paper (again, bringing extra can't hurt)
- Garbage can with extra bags
- Plates
- Bowls
- Cups (hot and cold)
- Silverware
- Serving tray/platter and bowls
- Serving spoons (regular and slotted)
- Cooking utensils (we usually take our own bamboo spoon set and spatula)
- Knife set (we always take our travel set so we can count on their sharpness)
- Cutting board
- Measuring cups & spoons
- Colander
- Vegetable peeler
- Baking sheet
- Baking dish
- Large pot
- Small sauce pan
- Frying pan
- Can opener (make sure it has a bottle opener too)
- Scissors
- Coffee maker
- Wood (most state and federal parks require you to purchase their wood)

The extras to consider bringing along

- Cast iron skillet
- Cast iron cookware scraper
- Cast iron scrub brush
- Cast iron skillet handle holder
- Zip top plastic bags (quart and gallon)

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The extras to consider bringing along (continued)

- Aluminum foil
- Parchment paper or parchment
- Small tongs
- Rubber scraper
- Whisk
- Ladle
- Small rolling pin
- Garlic chopper
- Vegetable brush
- Folding box grater
- Microplane grater
- Disposable gloves (for handling hot peppers)
- Work gloves
- Fire starter and lighter
- Small tool kit (just in case)
- Flashlights and headlamps
- Extra Batteries
- First aid kit
- iPod/Bluetooth speaker
- Board games and cards
- Plastic bin(s) to put it all in
- Snow shovel, brush, etc.

The pantry items to think about

- Water
- Beverages (hot, cold, adult)
- Salt & pepper
- Vegetable/olive oil
- Nonstick cooking spray
- Snacks (popcorn, granola bars, etc.)
- Supplies for each of the meals you'll have
